## NOTICE TO THE PROFESSION

## APPLICATIONS FOR THE CASE MANAGEMENT BY CONSENT

This revises the Notice to Profession, Case Management Guidelines (No. 2), dated December 22, 1999 (the "Notice") on steps to be taken to obtain a Fiat directing case management on consent. The process for contested applications for case management will continue as is, requiring an application supported by affidavit evidence on notice to the other party or parties.

The Notice currently states at page 2, in numbered paragraph 2, the following:

2. The parties, if they have agreed to case management, can submit a joint request to the Senior Judge outlining the nature of the case and why they consider case management to be helpful or necessary.

This paragraph is now revised to read as follows:

2. The parties, if they have agreed to case management, can submit a joint request to the <u>Manager of Supreme Court</u> outlining the nature of the case and why they consider case management to be helpful or necessary.
